May we please remind you that we are a NUT FREE SCHOOL and any snack or packed lunches must not contain items containing nuts. We have several children in school who are anaphylactic and carry epipens.



HEAD LICE

There have recently been a couple of cases of head lice identified in school. While lice are nothing more than a nuisance, it is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that any head lice can be dealt with quickly and before they can be allowed to spread. Please check your child's head as soon as possible. For further information please see your pharmacist of visit <u>www.nhs.uk/conditions/head-lice</u>. We appreciate your help to ensure we keep head lice outbreaks to a minimum.

FLU IMMUNISATION – RECEPTION TO YEAR 6

The School Immunisation Team will be in school on Monday 25th September for the flu vaccination for children in Reception to Year 6. You should have received an email regarding the programme and a link to the consent form.

Please make sure that you complete and submit your child's consent form as soon as you get it, whether you wish your child to be vaccinated or not and **only submit one consent form per child**.

Consents Forms must be submitted by 10am on 22nd September 2023, as we are unable to accept them after this date. You may be required to bring your child to a community clinic for a catch-up appointment, if you do not submit the consent form by the required date above.

VERY IMPORTANT – PUPIL MEDICAL INFORMATION

As we move into the colder months, some children can develop asthma like symptoms and are prescribed inhalers by their GP to help with their breathing. Although this is not as a result of an asthma diagnosis please inform the school as soon as possible.

We are undertaking a review of all medical records and medicines in school. If your child has a medical diagnosis, requires medication in school and you have not been contacted by Mr Smith please contact the school office or e-mail him directly on:

All medications sent to school must be on prescription and should be in the original container with your child's name visible and in date.

If your child has an inhaler in school, please check that it is in date.

As a school we do endeavour to check medication but ultimately this is the responsibility of carers and parents.

Please can I remind you that the use of mobile phones on school grounds is not permitted. Please refrain from using your mobile phone at drop off and pick up times. Do not be offended if a member of staff asks you to put your mobile phone away.






Macmillan Coffee Afternoon

NEARLY NEW UNIFORM SHOP

Is my child too ill for school?

Although lengthy, we thought you may find the following information helpful.

The Chief Medical Officer (CMO), Professor Chris Whitty, and leading health professionals have written to schools to provide advice for parents regarding illnesses and whether or not children should attend school. Children can attend school with a minor coughs and cold, provided they do not have a fever.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school on the first day. Let them know that your child won't be in and give them the reason.

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher know.

Other illnesses

Follow this advice for other illnesses:

Coughs and colds

It's fine to send your child to school with a minor <u>cough</u> or <u>common cold</u>. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.

High temperature

If your child has a high temperature, keep them off school until it goes away.

Chickenpox

If your child has <u>chickenpox</u>, keep them off school until all the spots have crusted over. This is usually about 5 days after the spots first appeared.

Cold sores

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have a <u>cold sore</u>.

Encourage them not to touch the blister or kiss anyone while they have the cold sore, or to share things like cups and towels.

Conjunctivitis

You don't need to keep your child away from school if they have <u>conjunctivitis</u>. Do get advice from your pharmacist. Encourage your child not to rub their eyes and to wash their hands regularly.

COVID-19

If your child has mild symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, and feels well enough, they can go to school. Your child should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people if they have <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u> and they either:

- have a high temperature
- · do not feel well enough to go to school or do their normal activities

Ear infection

If your child has an <u>ear infection</u> and a high temperature or severe earache, keep them off school until they're feeling better or their high temperature goes away.

Hand, foot and mouth disease

If your child has <u>hand, foot and mouth disease</u> but seems well enough to go to school, there's no need to keep them off. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues straight away and to wash their hands regularly.

Head lice and nits

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice. You can treat <u>head lice and nits</u> without seeing a GP.

Impetigo

If your child has <u>impetigo</u>, they'll need treatment from a GP, often with antibiotics. Keep them off school until all the sores have crusted over and healed, or for 48 hours after they start antibiotic treatment. Encourage your child to wash their hands regularly and not to share things like towels and cups with other children at school.

Ringworm

If your child has <u>ringworm</u>, see your pharmacist unless it's on their scalp, in which case you should see a GP. It's fine for your child to go to school once they have started treatment.

Scarlet fever

If your child has <u>scarlet fever</u>, they'll need treatment with antibiotics from a GP. Otherwise they'll be infectious for 2 to 3 weeks. Your child can go back to school 24 hours after starting antibiotics.

Slapped cheek syndrome (fifth disease)

You don't need to keep your child off school if they have <u>slapped cheek</u> <u>syndrome</u> because, once the rash appears, they're no longer infectious. But let the school or teacher know if you think your child has slapped cheek syndrome.

Sore throat

You can still send your child to school if they have a <u>sore throat</u>. But if they also have a high temperature, they should stay at home until it goes away. A sore throat and a high temperature can be symptoms of <u>tonsillitis</u>.

Threadworms

You don't need to keep your child off school if they have <u>threadworms</u>. Speak to your pharmacist, who can recommend a treatment.

Vomiting and diarrhoea

Children with <u>diarrhoea or vomiting</u> should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours).

INNOCULATIONS – MEASLES ADVICE

Measles is **very infectious** and can spread rapidly among communities, such as schools, if people have not been fully immunised with the MMR vaccine. While

most people recover completely within a couple of weeks, measles **can cause very serious illness** – _sometimes leading to permanent disability or even death. The best way to protect against measles is to make sure people/families are up to date with their MMR vaccines – which also protect against mumps and rubella.

TWO doses are needed to give maximum protection:

1st dose just after the child's first birthday

2nd dose at 3 years 4 months and certainly before children start school full time. Anyone who is not up to date with their MMR vaccines should be advised to **make an appointment with their GP as soon as possible, to get their MMR.** This is especially important when measles is circulating – as it is now.
