## **PSHE Policy**

## Intent

At Baldwins Gate Primary School, *Personal, Social, Health and Economic* (PSHE) including *Relationships and Sex Education* (RSE), is a key part of our school values and ethos. It enables our pupils to become independent, confident, healthy and responsible members of society. Our children know the values of respect and tolerance and are prepared to face and manage the challenges and opportunities they encounter in their school life and the wider community.

## Implementation

PSHE and RSE is shaped by our school ethos and our aim is to enable all pupils, regardless of background, ability or additional needs, to be the best version of themselves.

Children are taught the PSHE curriculum in a regular time tabled lesson. Each year group has a scheme to plan lessons based on the ENTRUST guidance.

There are 6 themes which are taught as a spiral curriculum so that topics are re-visited in more depth to match the maturity of the pupils. The themes are:

- •Me and My Safety (including E-safety)
- •Me and My School (Democracy and British values)
- •Me and Other People (Community)
- •Happy and Healthy Me (RSE)
- •Me and My Relationships (Equality)
- •Me in The World (Global Citizenship and Economic)

Lessons are adapted to meet the needs of each individual class/pupil.

Lessons are delivered in a way that ensures pupils feel safe and encourages participation by using a variety of teaching approaches.

PSHE is also an important part of school worship were the children's spiritual, moral, social and cultural curiosity is stimulated, challenged and nurtured.

## Impact

The pupil's attitude, behaviour and demeanour around school, within lessons, at playtimes and out in the community demonstrates the respect, tolerance and high aspirations that our pupils have of themselves and others.

Our pupils are willing to push themselves and try new things. They are confident, well-rounded, tolerant and independent.

By the time they leave our school, our pupils are ready for their next step into Secondary school and have the understanding, knowledge, skills and tools to go forward into adulthood.
